The Third Sunday of Lent 4th March 2018

(Year B, weekday cycle 1, Office week 3)

Canon Paul writes: Our Gospel this Sunday takes us to Jerusalem at Passover time when people from all over the land would gather there to recall and celebrate their ancestors' liberation from slavery in Egypt and the beginning of the 40 year journey through the wilderness to the Promised Land. In his Gospel, St. John tells us of three occasions when the 'Passover' was particularly significant for Jesus. One is today when Jesus shows his anger in the Temple; another is when Jesus presents himself as the bread of life at the synagogue at Capernaum and the final occasion is when Jesus dies just as the Passover Lambs are being sacrificed in the Temple.

Today's Passover experience sees Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem. For the people of Jesus's time, the Temple, which had been built for them by Herod the Great, was a sacred place. At its heart was a building called the 'Holy of Holies' where the presence of God dwelt. This was the place where people offered animal sacrifice for the forgiveness of their sins and this was the place where they came to pray, just as the Jewish people pray today at the western wall of the Temple complex.

In a very radical and prophetic action Jesus expelled the money changers and the animals from the Temple. The Jewish people asked Jesus to justify his action because it was so significant. Its significance was in the fact that by driving out the money changers and the animals, crucial for the religious system that operated, he was putting an end to the Temple and everything for which it stood. The time was approaching when the presence of God was to be found in human lives and relationships. At another Passover, Jesus would say "Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me". (John 6. 56-57)

Jesus's action in the Temple and the gift of his Body and Blood define what we are as members of the Church. We are those who "worship in spirit and truth" (John 4.24) and, in a sense, we are here to replace the Temple in Jerusalem. Our lives both personally and as a community, which eats and drinks the Body and Blood of Jesus, exist to become and make visible the presence of Jesus who is the Word and Son of God. That is why our love, our unity and our respect for one another is central to our lives and work as disciples.

At the heart of all this is our abiding in Christ whose love is in us. And this is why our weekly celebration of the Sunday Mass is a most serious obligation. As Jesus said "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh". (John 6. 51)
